# From the President

Hello Everyone.

The committee has been looking at replacing our cold room facilities. The present cold room is very old and the insulating panels have become waterlogged over time. In addition the glass doors have lost their vacuum seals and have become inefficient.

We are not sure how old this cold room is but we do know that it was a second hand unit when it was installed about 15 years ago. Our power bills are still quite high and most of this electricity is being used to run the cold room.

We have applied to the Gambling Community Fund for funds to replace the cold room and we have been successful. We now have about \$21000 to spend on a replacement cold room. Currently we are investigating the best cold room design to suit our requirements. In addition we are considering spending some more funds on improving the bar itself.

These improvements may involve short rails on either side of the service area, a foot rest around the bar and better arrangements for the spirit bottles and ice supplies. We have recently removed a number of broken bar stools and replaced them with new ones at a cost of about \$1400. If you have ideas of your own please pass them on to a committee member. Most reports on the new bar stools are positive.

Our hard working treasurer Ray Pendreigh celebrated his 80th birthday recently. Most people are winding down when they turn 80 but Ray is doing the opposite. Congratulations to Ray on turning 80.

Again, thank you to all the volunteers who are giving their time to maintain the successful operation of the club. We cannot exist without you.

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### New coldroom to save club money

The Cungulla Recreational Fishing and Social Club will look to replace the cold room in the community hall in hopes to save the club valuable money in powerbills.

The club recieved a grant of \$21 000 from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund to fully customise a new coldroom to service the community hall's needs. The new coldroom will be slightly smaller, said to be approximately two thirds the size of the current unit.

At the moment electricity is the one of the major costs to the club with most of the power use attributed to the coldroom. The committee is hoping that with the instalment of the new coldroom we will see a significant reduction in these costs.

The current cold room was installed 15 years ago as a second hand unit and now struggles with water logged insulator panels and broken seals.

In recent times the club has been successful in its last three grant applications, providing the hall with solar panels and a stand-by generator to cover the power failures experienced from time to time in Cungulla.

### **Crossing Recovery Creek**

Cungulla's story is one that is fairly untold, but the scars of accessing Big Beach still remain.

Just a short walk from the now used bridge is a slab of concrete resting on the bank of the creek. This 10 tonne pier was laid by Honorary Secretary of the Cungulla Hut Owners Association, Reg Hinspeter in the 1980's and was used as a make-shift crossing.

Until these slabs were laid access to Big Beach was via a corduroy across the salt pans built and regularly maintained by residents.





Mr Hinspeter's contribution didn't stop at the access bridge, he represented the people of Cungulla in the long running fight for access to the town and the Crown Land Sales that occurred through the 1970's and 80's.

Currently the bridge across Recovery Creek is unnamed, so we are seeking your opinion as to whether it is time we gave it the unofficial name of Hinspeter Bridge'.

We are on the hunt for information on Cungulla's History in the 1970s and 80s in the hopes of putting together a small project for the town if you have any information or documents you wish to share with us please contact Mikayla on 0488195127.

### Seafood Recipe of the Month Crab Linguine with chilli

#### and parsely

Adapted from BBC Good Food Recipes **INGREDIENTS** 400grams Linguine tbl spoon olive oil splash of white wine the meat from 1-2 cooked mud crabs 1 red chilli (seeds removed) 2 cloves of garlic finely chopped squeeze of lemon (optional) handful of flat leaf parsley

#### METHOD

Cook pasta for 1 min less than instructions and strain Add olive oil, garlic and chilli. Add wine to frying pan and simmer Add pasta to the pan and remove from the heat Add cooked crab meat and parsely and toss through Add lemon if you prefer
