# CUNGULLA RECREATION, FISHING & SOCIAL CLUB (INC) 2024 FISHING COMPETITION GUIDELINES

<u>FISHING REGULATIONS</u>:- Are directed by the Department of Agriculture & Fisheries (DAF) and the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA) and apply in all cases. There are some additional club imposed restrictions and these are outlined as follows.

Any disputes arising will be dealt with be dealt with by a panel made up of no less than two members of the club's committee as well as the Fishing Coordinator. The panel's decision is final and cannot be appealed.

The fishing coordinator for 2024 is Dennis McCloskey.

All marine vessel owners and operators competing in club competitions are to abide by the Transport Operations ( Marine Safety) Act 1994.

#### **NOMINATIONS**

Under the constitution there will be no nomination fees.

All financial members of the club are eligible to enter in any monthly event. The fishing coordinator must be given advance notice of any blue water nominations.

Members must be financial in order to receive an award at the annual presentation event.

#### **COMPETITION TIMES**

Fishing is permitted from **12.01 a.m**. Saturday until **4.00 p.m**. Sunday for the event dates

Crab pots can be set from **12 noon** on Friday until **4.00 pm** Sunday for the event dates.

#### **ALLOWED FISHING AREAS**

Teams events are bound by and include Cocoa and Bomber Creeks and all creeks and rivers in between. Fishing is permitted from the tree lines and along beaches in between these estuaries that can be reached in a vehicle or on foot.

#### **FISH SPECIES AND SCORING:**

All eligible fish presented will generate a "Q" score. These "Q" scores and eligible species are listed in Appendix 1. Where more than type of a fish species occurs (e.g. black and silver bream) a competitor may submit a fish of each type. "Morwong" are not accepted.

#### **FISH SIZES:**

All fish submitted must be two (2) cm. longer than the D.A.F. minimum size. This is referred to as the "Club Legal Size." See Appendix 1. Fish will be measured as they lie on the ruler.

#### WEIGH- IN.

This is held on the Sunday of each competition at the club from 4 p.m. to 5 p.m. Teams who cannot attend the Sunday weigh-in can tag their fish and leave them with another member to weigh in. In exceptional cases the fishing coordinator can measure fish and weigh crabs.

## The club strongly recommends that all fishing competitors attend the weigh in.

Fish must be presented whole- bled, gutted and gilled is permitted.

Fish and crabs can be measured over the weekend **primarily for members who live out of town. The Fishing Coordinator, President, Vice-President and Fish Measurer** can measure fish and/or crabs as well as Bluewater fish.

#### **POINTS**

Points are calculated using this formula.

## Points= (Fish length÷ Club Minimum) X "Q" score

"Q" scores can be found in Appendix 1.

## **AGE DIVISIONS**

Seniors	18 years and over	Male
Seniors	18 years and over	Female
Juniors	13 to 17 years	Boys and Girls
Minor Juniors	0 to 12 years	Boys and Girls

The age that a participant turns during that year determines the division the member is in. Juniors and minor juniors must advise the coordinator of their date of birth when they weigh in their first fish. All competitors must fish in their correct age division.

#### **COMPETITION CANCELLATIONS:**

The President and/or Fishing Coordinator can cancel a competition when deemed necessary to do so.

#### **2024 FISHING EVENT DETAILS**

#### **TEAMS EVENT**

Teams will consist of a minimum of two (2) and a maximum of four (4) financial club members comprised of seniors and/or juniors. A team can use a maximum of no more than two boats on the water at any given time during competition times.

A team must nominate team members before participating in their first competition. A team register will be maintained. Teams with less than four members can add additional members during the year up to a maximum of four. The coordinator must be informed.

An individual can nominate in one team only. The committee has the right to allow a member to change teams due to extenuating circumstances.

#### ANNUAL TEAMS RESULTS- TEAM OF THE YEAR.

A team can present up to five eligible fish with no more than one fish from each species.

Any fish presented for the "Target" competition cannot be used again in the Team's bag.

The "Q" score system will be used to generate each teams monthly total.

The best eight monthly results will contribute to an annual "Team of the Year" award.

#### **MONTHLY TARGET SPECIES:**

A team can present one fish only toward the monthly Target species competition. See Appendix "A" This fish will give a team entry into the monthly random draw. Team members do not have to be present at the weigh in.

#### **MONTHLY PRIZES:**

Teams Event- 3 X Random vouchers for \$20 each

Target Species- 2 X Random Vouchers of \$20 each

#### **LONGEST FISH LEADER BOARDS** (From all teams during the year)

Species are <u>Black Bream; Spotted Grunter</u>; <u>Dusky Flathead</u>; <u>Cooktown Salmon</u> and <u>Whiting</u>
Annual prize for each species to be determined.

#### **MUD CRAB COMPETITION (INDIVIDUAL)**

A mud crab competition will be held in conjunction with the monthly teams events.

**CRAB SIZE**: Crabs must be male and a minimum of 150m.m. across the carapace.

#### **WEIGH IN**

Financial members can weigh in one (1) crab per event.

Crabs are to be submitted green, tied and alive at the weigh in.

#### **MONTHLY CRAB PRIZES** ARE 3 x RANDOM DRAWS

#### **ANNUAL CRAB PRIZES ARE**

- 1. Heaviest crab 1<sup>st</sup> (T.B.A)
- 2. Aggregate weight from eight (8) events 1<sup>st</sup>; 2<sup>nd</sup>; 3<sup>rd</sup> (T.B.A.)

### **BARRAMUNDI COMPETITIONS (INDIVIDUAL)**

There will be two barramundi competitions in 2024, in **February** and **October**. In February the target species will be barramundi. All team members as well as other financial members can weigh in a barramundi. There will be three random draws of \$20 each for this competition. Barramundi presented for the barra comp cannot become part of any teams "bag".

The <u>October Barra competition</u> will be a stand alone competition not associated with the teams event or target species competitions. Prize money will be allocated (\$500) provided by sponsors. Non -members will be invited but are required to become members. Brag mats will be issued to competitors and barramundi from 58 cms to 120 cms will be accepted. Prizes will go to the biggest fish, a mystery length and random draws.

#### **BLUEWATER EVENTS.**

Members can fish on two consecutive days in a calendar month.

Selected fishing days must be given to the fishing coordinator before the event.

Members are able to weigh in up to five fish with just one from each eligible species.

All fish will be rated against the "Q" points system to calculate a monthly result. See Appendix 1.

**Monthly targeted species** - 2 X Random Draws

**Monthly Prizes** – 2 X Random Draws

#### **ANNUAL BLUEWATER PRIZES**

The best 8 monthly results will decide the winners

**Seniors** 1<sup>st</sup> and 2nd and **Juniors** 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### CHILDREN'S FISHING COMPETITIONS.

**GENERAL OUJTLINE**: Junior and minor junior fishing competitions will encompass **TWO** sections.

The Annual Champions will be decided by the individual **Longest Linear Meterage** of all fish submitted.

**Section 1**: Land bases competitions- to be conducted at Vivienne Lyons Park or Big Beach. Section 1 events are open to financial and non financial children. Daily prizes are on offer.

Financial juniors can add their fish to their cumulative score.

All fish recorded towards annual champion totals must be club eligible species and of club legal length.

**Section 2**: 10 X Monthly Teams Competitions. Juniors/ Minor Juniors can be part of a team or an individual and can submit up to five different eligible species at the Sunday afternoon weigh in. These fish can also contribute towards their team's competition results.
